- 22 **PUBLIC COMMENT:** None
- 23 **RETREAT GOALS**
- 24 A summary of this meeting from Freshtracks Communications has been attached to these minutes.
- 25 Ms. Seana Doherty, with Freshtracks Communications went over the goals of the Retreat. There were several
- activities done to show Board and staff that everyone works together as a team.
- 27 **PUBLIC COMMENT:** None
- 28 IMPLICATIONS OF THE NEW "WHY" STATEMENT
- 29 There was a video shown, entitled "How Great Leaders Inspire Action", by Simon Sinek, followed by a discussion
- 30 about what stood out in the film. There was an activity done to create a "Why" statement for the Airport,
- 31 focusing on why the Airport does what it does, instead of only focusing on what the Airport does.
- 32 Discussion followed regarding why each participant works with and/or for the Airport.
- 33 **BREAK:** At 12:03 p.m. the Board recessed for a lunch. At 12:45 p.m. President Jones reconvened the meeting.
- 34 FAST PITCH SESSION
- 35 Ms. Doherty stated that the "Why" of the Airport is that Board and staff are passionate about the community and
- the Airport's impact on it.
- 37 The next exercise was for the Board and staff to do a two minute pitch on projects, initiatives, ideas and concepts
- 38 they are most excited about. After all pitches were given, there was a vote, and the resulting list was discussed.
- 39 The top three included: trails, a multi-use hangar, and a five-way tie between composting, flight tracking, aviation

- 40 customer support, safety culture, and an insulation program. There was discussion about the tie, and it was
- 41 decided that safety culture should be on the priority list with trails and a multi-use hangar.

42 **SUMMARIZE RETREAT AND NEXT STEPS**

- 43 Ms. Doherty gave a summary of the morning's activities and some of the next steps to take in moving forward.
- These include putting a criteria in place for decision making, and working on the priority list.
- 45 **BREAK:** At 2:45 p.m. the Board recessed for a short break. At 3:04 p.m. President Jones reconvened the meeting
- 46 to include the Truckee Town Council.
- 47 Introductions took place between the Airport District Board of Directors and staff, and the Truckee Town Council.
- 48 Mr. Tony Lashbrook, Town Manager, gave a presentation on the history of the Town of Truckee. He also pointed
- 49 out the instances where the Town of Truckee and the Truckee Tahoe Airport have partnered, stating that he
- 50 hopes for partnerships in the future.
- Mr. Smith gave an update on the Airport Master Plan along with a timeline. He compared the current Master Plan
- with the 1998 Master Plan, pointing out the differences in primary focus. In 1998, the primary focus was
- 53 maximum growth, whereas currently, the primary focus is annoyance mitigation. Mr. Smith gave a background on
- how the Board arrived at the current alternatives being considered in the Master Plan revision, and what was
- 55 removed and why.
- Mr. Smith gave an update and explanation on the CLUP process. Because the Master Plan is being updated, the
- 57 CLUP also needs to be updated. The Airport is currently a B2 airport, and Mr. Smith stated that going any larger
- would be a difficult fit for the Airport and the community around it.
- 59 The next step in the CLUP update is to begin discussions with Cal Aeronautics on the funding for the update. This
- 60 update will likely begin in early 2016.
- 61 Ms. Denyelle Nishimori, Senior Planner for the Town of Truckee, gave a presentation on development projects in
- 62 relationship to the CLUP, and overall in the community. The specific plans for the future include PC1 and PC3,
- 63 while the master plans include Truckee Springs and Hilltop development. The only subdivision left to complete
- 64 development on is Canyon Springs. The compatibility zone policies were discussed.
- 65 There was a lengthy discussion regarding Clear Capital and future development in that area. The Town and the
- 66 Airport District will explore the possibility of having both agencies work together to have help Clear Capital remain
- 67 in Truckee. There was discussion about a possible annexation of the land Clear Capital is considering leasing into
- 68 the Town of Truckee. Mr. Smith and Mr. Lashbrook will work on various options, including meeting with Placer
- 69 County, Nevada County Planning, Nevada County LAFCO and Clear Capital. They will then report back to the Town
- 70 Council and Airport Board.





- 3. Flight Tracking, Safety Culture, Aviation Customer Support, Composting, Insulation Program all tied for 3rd with 3 votes
- 4. Non-profit storage, outreach to younger generation, more events measure economic impacts, night curfew research, outreach to users, temporary summer tower, open space endowment, underwrite STEM teachers

Remember: These are ideas the group is excited about based on individual experience, community outreach, Master Plan feedback, Godbe Survey and other sources. These are not priorities for the District as set by the Baord of Directors. These are ideas and concepts to build on in future planning meetings, ACAT meetings, Board Meetings, Budget Workshops, and other forums to discuss and move noteworthy ideas forward.

Next Steps

- Follow up and incorporate the "WHY" concept, proposed pitch ideas, and comments into future strategic plan <u>meetings</u>, budget <u>workshops</u>, regular Board Meetings for further discussion, definition, and priority.
- 2. Work towards incorporating ideas and comments into appropriate planning <u>documents</u> such as Strategic <u>Plan</u>, Master Plan, Capital Facilities Plans, and other District guiding documents.
- 3. Similar abbreviated WHY exercise with District Staff may be beneifical.
