AGENDA TITLE:	Approval of Declaration of 100LL Refueling Truck as Surplus Property and Authorizing Sale to Nevada County Airport

RECOMMENDED ACTION: (Approve by Consent) Declare the 2,200 gallon 100LL refueling truck (see attached picture) surplus property and allow the sale of truck to Nevada County Airport for the sum of \$40,000.

DISCUSSION: The TTAD has a new 1,000 gallon 100LL refueling truck on order with expected arrival to the District in the first week of May 2019. The replacement truck was purchased with funds allotted in the Districts 2019 Fiscal Budget in the amount of \$168,000. The decision to make the purchase of the newer, smaller refueler was driven by the age of the current truck (2002 model) and lack of performance of the diesel engine on the 2,200 gallon truck. The low overnight winter temperatures that we experience at KTRK have proven to be challenging for the units diesel engine and has left us unable to provide proper fueling services to our pilots. The new truck has been downsized to a 1,000 gallon tank that is mounted on a smaller gasoline chassis which will be more reliable in cold winter temperatures.

FISCAL IMPACT: We have completed comparisons on similar 100LL refueling trucks and with the help of our aviation fuel provider, AvFuel, we found the unit to have a value of approx. \$45,000 - \$50,000. We feel based on the required staff time, length of time to sell, and the cost of advertising, it would be cost effective for the District to sell the refueling truck to the Nevada County Airport for \$40,000. Nevada County Airport is a neighboring airport located in one of our Counties and is in need of a serviceable 100LL refueler. The Truck will perform much better at their elevation and climate.
