45 **MOTION #2 DECEMBER 1, 2021:** Director Stephens motioned to approve the Consent Items: Tab Items  
46 02 – 04. Director Hetherington seconded the motion. President O’Dette, yes. Vice President Diamond,  
47 yes. Director Stephens, yes. Director Rohlf, yes. Director Hetherington, yes. The motion passed via roll call  
48 vote.

49 **2021 AGENCY PARTNERSHIP APPLICATIONS REVIEW AND POSSIBLE FUNDING DECISIONS (TAB 05)**

50 Ms. Phyllis McConn, Community Impact Officer with the Tahoe Truckee Community Foundation, reviewed  
51 the Agency Partnership Application Review presentation for the Board of Directors. There was a request  
52 to review if there were any conflicts of interests between sitting Board Members and the entities that  
53 submitted Agency Partnership applications. There were no conflicts of interests noted. Discussion ensued  
54 regarding Placer County’s Capital Improvement Program grant processes, the potential selection  
55 processes the Board might take (since a selection process was not outlined by the Agency Partnership Ad  
56 Hoc Committee), District budget amounts set aside for Housing, Transportation, and Agency Partnerships,  
57 Agency Partnership funds not being tied to non-profit employee positions, and different funding scenarios  
58 proposed by District Board Members.

75 Director Hetherington noted that she will only be voting for Agency Partnership Applications that have  
76 submitted all required application materials for funding.

77 **MOTION #3 DECEMBER 1, 2021:** Vice President Diamond made a motion to fund the Friends of the  
78 Truckee Tahoe Library the sum of \$50,000 for one year, provided that the Friends of the Truckee Tahoe  
79 Library agrees that the Truckee Tahoe Airport District will be provided a full-time physical location or wall  
80 space in the future library facility to provide materials related to the Airport District and careers and  
81 opportunities in Aviation, and that the Friends of the Truckee Tahoe Library further agrees to recognize  
82 the Airport District in all published materials, online and in print, where donors and other sponsors are  
83 listed. Director Hetherington seconded the motion. President O’Dette, abstain. Vice President Diamond,

84 yes. Director Stephens, yes. Director Rohlf, yes. Director Hetherington, yes. The motion passed via roll call  
85 vote.

86 **MOTION #4 DECEMBER 1, 2021:** Director Stephens made a motion to fund Gateway Mountain Center for  
87 \$50,000 as part of outreach, curriculum, and/or program, participating youth as appropriate be informed  
88 of opportunities and resources available to them at the Truckee Tahoe Airport including Civil Air Patrol,  
89 Young Eagles, along with information about careers in aviation. And participating youth be provided an  
90 opportunity to tour and visit the Truckee Tahoe Airport. Director Rohlf seconded the motion. President  
91 O’Dette, yes. Vice President Diamond, yes. Director Stephens, yes. Director Rohlf, yes. Director  
92 Hetherington, yes. The motion passed via roll call vote.

93 **MOTION #5 DECEMBER 1, 2021:** Director Stephens made a motion to fund Sierra Community House in  
94 the amount of \$50,000 as Sierra Community House is a non-aeronautical District Tenant in our  
95 Warehouse. The District desires for them to be successful in providing services to the District and to  
96 successfully leverage the investments the District has made in our warehouse facilities. Services rendered  
97 in this application provide potential benefit and access to all District constituents. Director Rohlf seconded  
98 the motion. President O’Dette, yes. Vice President Diamond, yes. Director Stephens, yes. Director Rohlf,  
99 yes. Director Hetherington, abstain. The motion passed via roll call vote.

100 **MOTION #6 DECEMBER 1, 2021:** Director Rohlf made a motion to fund the Tahoe Cross Country Ski  
101 Association in the amount of \$153,770 as Tahoe XC will continue to support STEAM education as well as  
102 provide hands on nature-based education raising awareness for the need to reduce carbon footprints and  
103 manage forest lands and other STEAM and GHG reduction initiatives. These nature-based, science  
104 education programs which the new lodge will facilitate offer important foundational education  
105 concerning industry government in our community as well as the Airport District. Support of this project  
106 will further these important District goals. President O’Dette seconded the motion. President O’Dette,  
107 yes. Vice President Diamond, yes. Director Stephens, yes. Director Rohlf, yes. Director Hetherington, yes.  
108 The motion passed via roll call vote.

109 **MOTION #7 DECEMBER 1, 2021:** President O’Dette made a motion to fund the Human Society of Truckee-  
110 Tahoe in the amount of \$100,000 as the Airport is identified as a vital facility in various local and regional  
111 emergency management plans and programs, assisting with funding of an Animal Emergency  
112 Preparedness Plan can assist the District in plan implementation should use of District facilities be  
113 necessary during emergencies. Vice President Diamond seconded the motion. All District constituents will  
114 have access to and can benefit from creation of an Animal Emergency Preparedness plan. President  
115 O’Dette, yes. Vice President Diamond, yes. Director Stephens, abstain. Director Rohlf, yes. Director  
116 Hetherington, abstain. The motion passed via roll call vote.

117 **MOTION #8 DECEMBER 1, 2021:** Director Hetherington made a motion to fund Biking for a Better World  
118 in the amount of \$74,988 as a portion of the Truckee Bike Park is located on District property, support of  
119 this application allows District constituents to enjoy use and benefit of this property. Director Stephens  
120 seconded the motion. President O’Dette, yes. Vice President Diamond, yes. Director Stephens, yes.  
121 Director Rohlf, yes. Director Hetherington, yes. The motion passed via roll call vote.

122 **MOTION #9 DECEMBER 1, 2021:** Director Rohlf made a motion to fund Sierra Watershed Education  
123 Partnerships (SWEP) in the amount of \$50,000 as the District has a goal to reduce carbon emissions, this  
124 goal can be furthered by supporting new and creative methods to reduce emissions as proposed by SWEP  
125 in this partnership request. Supporting this SWEP program will assist the District in reducing local and  
126 regional GHG emissions. President O’Dette seconded the motion. President O’Dette, yes. Vice President  
127 Diamond, abstain. Director Stephens, yes. Director Rohlf, yes. Director Hetherington, abstain. The motion  
128 passed via roll call vote.

129 **MOTION #10 DECEMBER 1, 2021:** Director Hetherington made a motion to fund the Truckee Downtown  
130 Merchants Association in the amount of \$7,000. Truckee Downtown Merchants Association must give the

131 Airport District recognition as a sponsor of the event and provide the Airport District booth space at  
132 Truckee Thursday events. Director Rohlf seconded the motion. President O’Dette, yes. Vice President  
133 Diamond, abstain. Director Stephens, abstain. Director Rohlf, yes. Director Hetherington, yes. The motion  
134 passed via roll call vote.

135 **MOTION #11 DECEMBER 1, 2021:** Director Hetherington made a motion to fund North Tahoe Public  
136 Utility District in the amount of \$10,000 as the Airport District be featured in the geo-triggered mobile  
137 app that gets users outside, active, and engaged in their natural world. The District can take advantage of  
138 this augmented reality mobile app platform, the Agents of Discovery program allowing local students,  
139 residents, and visitors to experience STEAM-themed educational missions and challenges in North Lake  
140 Tahoe. This partnership will be able to feature the Airport providing information to users as well as  
141 enhance or STEM goals. President O’Dette, abstain. Vice President Diamond, abstain. Director Stephens,  
142 abstain. Director Rohlf, yes. Director Hetherington, yes. The motion failed via roll call vote.

143 **MOTION #12 DECEMBER 1, 2021:** Director O’Dette made a motion to approve project A for the North  
144 Tahoe Fire Protection District (NTFPD) in the amount of \$90,905 as the NTFPD is a local first responder for  
145 the District concerning any aircraft accident or incident in the Lake Tahoe Basin, the District wishes to  
146 assure they have current and up to date medical equipment critical to patient care. Director Stephens  
147 seconded the motion. President O’Dette, yes. Vice President Diamond, abstain. Director Stephens, yes.  
148 Director Rohlf, yes. Director Hetherington, abstain. The motion passed via roll call vote.

149 Mr. Smith noted that the 2022 Agency Partnership application process will be updated to have a more  
150 defined procedure regarding the selection process. The Ad Hoc Committee and staff will meet in early  
151 spring to discussion updates to PI 311 and will bring back a revised policy in March of 2022 prior to the  
152 next cycle.

153 The Board thanked the Agency Partnership Selection Committee for their time vetting all the applications,  
154 as well as encouraged those entities that were not selected to reapply in 2022.

155 **GENERAL MANAGERS REPORT (TAB 06)**

156 Mr. Smith reviewed his General Managers report for the Board of Directors. Mr. Smith reviewed  
157 Conference and Training opportunities mentioning that himself and Hardy Bullock will be attending the  
158 Aviation Issues Conference this year. Discussion ensued amongst the Board on various items noted in the  
159 Safety and Security Report as well as scheduling a Board workshop for District Goals. There was consensus  
160 that the Board will wait to complete goals for 2022 until after the District Revenue and Cost Allocation  
161 Study Special Meeting on January 5<sup>th</sup>.

174 versus October 2020, the development of a community outreach campaign/strategy, expenses for the  
175 flight procedure development, as well as Staffs decision not to renew CAA’s fuel discount contract.

177 Mr. Brian McCafferty made a public comment regarding not renewing the fuel contract with CAA.

178 Mr. Erik Peligard made a public comment regarding short hop operations to fuel up at other Airports that  
179 have CAA pricing.

180 Mr. Collin Butcher made a public comment suggesting tenants to operate out of other northern Nevada  
181 airports that has CAA pricing and drive into Truckee.

182 Mr. Dan McGee made a public comment regarding discontinuing fuel purchases at Truckee if CAA is not  
183 renewed.

184 **APPROVAL OF FY 2022 FINAL TTAD BUDGET (TAB 10)**

185 Ms. Woo reviewed the 2022 Final Budget with Narrative and Capital Summary. After a general review of  
186 the Budget Narrative, the Board asked questions on various budget line items in the proposed Budget and

199 presented which includes additional flagging the 2022 Airshow and Family Festival, removal of the Loader,

201 motion. President O’Dette, yes. Vice President Diamond, yes. Director Stephens, yes. Director Rohlf, yes.  
202 Director Hetherington, yes. The motion passed via roll call vote.

203 **2021 EMPLOYEE CLASSIFICATION AND COMPENSATION STUDY (TAB 11)**

204 Mr. Smith reviewed the staff report and study recommendations for the Board of Directors. Discussion  
205 ensued regarding the process in determining position FLSA exemption statuses and exemption categories,  
206 and differences between total cash amounts and total compensations amounts referenced in the results  
207 of the compensation market survey.

215 **PAVEMENT MAINTENANCE PLAN PRESENTATION AND APPROVAL (TAB 12)**

216 Mr. Smith reviewed the Pavement Maintenance Plan staff report for the Board of Directors. Discussion  
217 ensued regarding the different cross section strengths of the runways, environmental factors of pavement  
218 life, the need for the District to collect data of aircraft over 80k pounds, the ability of the District to  
219 reevaluate/adjust the Pavement Maintenance Plan if the airport receives less traffic or more traffic, and  
220 the idea of having an additional landing fee for operations above 80k pounds.

221 **PUBLIC COMMENT:**

224 limits in the pavement maintenance program.

225 Mr. Todd Barbarovich made a public comment regarding the need for operators to pay for pavement  
226 maintenance costs.

227 Mr. Brian McCafferty made a public regarding FAA Fuel Tax as the major funding source being used for  
228 airport construction projects.

229 Mr. Erik Peligard made a public comment regarding aircraft's basic weight being used to set fees.

230 Mr. Collin Butcher made a public comment noting that airport operators should support airport  
231 maintenance through the user fees.

232 **MOTION #16 DECEMBER 1, 2021:** Vice President Diamond made a motion to accept the 2021 District  
233 Pavement Maintenance and Management Plan as provided and recommended by staff. Director Stephens  
234 seconded the motion. President O'Dette, yes. Vice President Diamond, yes. Director Stephens, yes.  
235 Director Rohlf, yes. Director Hetherington, yes. The motion passed via roll call vote.

236 **REVIEW AND RECOMMENDATION ON PENDING AERONAUTICAL LEASE RENEWALS (TAB 13)**

237 Mr. Bullock reviewed the staff report on the pending aeronautical lease renewals for the Board of  
238 Directors and the Districts rationale around the decision to reevaluate these aeronautical leases. Discussion  
239 ensued regarding why Sky Dive Truckee is the only lease that is being recommended to be terminated and  
240 then renegotiated, the thought of delaying renegotiation until after the Cost Allocation Special Meeting  
241 in January, and the lease renegotiation schedule staff provided to the Board (table 1 in the staff report).

252 reviewing aeronautical commercial leases.

253 Ms. Karol Hines made a public comment in support of Sky Dive Truckee.

254 Mr. Erik Peligard made a public comment regarding the possibility of transitioning Sky Dive Truckee’s lease  
255 to month-to-month.
