RECOMMENDED ACTION: No action is requested of the Truckee Tahoe Airport District (TTAD, District) Board of Directors at this time. This is an informational status report only, as a Final Project Evaluation review of Agency Partnerships entered into during the 2021 funding cycle. The program is being administered by the Tahoe Truckee Community Foundation (TTCF).

<u>DISCUSSION:</u> TTAD engaged the Tahoe Truckee Community Foundation in April of 2021 as a consultant to manage the administrative and application side of the District's annual Agency Partnership program for a period of three annual funding cycles (2021-2023).

In the late fall of 2021, the TTAD Board of Directors voted to enter into nine Agency Partnerships with a total funding obligation of \$626,673. As part of the recipient contractual funding agreement, certain obligations are required, such as: timely completion of the partnership "project goals", recognition of TTAD as a funding partner, and a final project evaluation report no later than a year and a month from the effective date of the agreement. The nine 2021 partnerships in discussion were contractually entered into in late January 2022.

TTCF has provided the final project evaluation report attached to this staff report. TTCF representative Mrs. Phyllis McConn and/or Ms. Dana Crary will be present to answer any Board questions.

<u>WHAT'S NEXT:</u> Final Project Evaluations are provided in the attached TTCF document for eight of the nine 2021 Agency Partnership recipient organizations. This report closes the 2021 Agency Partnership cycle for those eight recipient organizations.

The Tahoe Cross Country Ski Education Association (TXCSEA) received \$153,770 in Agency Partnership funding. Due to project permitting delays, they had requested, and been approved a project extension through August 31, 2023. To date, TXCSEA has expended only \$1,368 of their Agency Partnership funding. TTCF will report back later with a timely update on the TXCSEA project progress.

FISCAL IMPACT: The TTAD Board committed \$626,673 from the 2021 TTAD budget in Agency Partnership funding which has been fully distributed. Of that total, all but \$152,402 has been expended by the recipients.

<u>PUBLIC COMMUNICATIONS</u>: The Agency Partnership outreach and recognition opportunity has been communicated by Agency Partnership recipients as reported in the attached TTCF presentation. TTAD and TTCF also market the program when and where appropriate through their standard community outreach tools.




