

Director of Aviation

The largest event of the year was this past month's Maker Show with over 2,200 people in attendance. Communications continue with the airport community on construction. One fire helicopter contracted by CalFire is on the ramp for the summer, and a second helicopter contracted by the USFS will be on the ramp staring July 1st.

Our ATC tower received 3 major awards from their company MidWest ATC which include: ATC Facility of the Year, ATC Manager of the Year (Larry), and Controller of the Year (Todd).


Fly Quiet

In May 28 households submitted a total of 70 comments. Martis Valley Estates accounted for 30 comments, mostly about Jet departures off Runway 29 or landings on Runway 11.

16 Comments were due to student pilot touch and go training with all but one related to Runway 29.

20 aircraft operations occurred during quiet hours, two less than May, 2024. Two comments were generated by these operations. With sunrise occurring in the 5am hour coinciding with our peak season for air traffic, June and July will likely see the highest number of Quiet Hour operations of the year, mainly departures around 6:30am.

On Wednesday, June 18 CalFire Air Attack
Battalion Chief, Dave Krussow joined us to speak on
aircraft wildfire fighting operations. This timely
presentation helped our local pilot community better
understand how to safely avoid a Fire Traffic Area
(FTA), what resources CAL FIRE uses for an airassault and why a Temporary Flight Restriction (TFR)
may not be in established yet over a blaze. The audience had a healthy round of Q&A with 29 pilots in
attendance.
