Director of Aviation

Operations increased again this month on a year-over -year basis, supported by favorable weather conditions and the absence of wildfire smoke. The growth was primarily driven by increased piston aircraft.

Two media articles were published this month highlighting the District's **Fly Safe program** and our **"Airbnb-style" hangar program** (attached). Both provided strong coverage of the District's pioneering initiatives and commitment to community partnership.

Hangar revitalization efforts continue with progress on facility renovations and ongoing enforcement of hangar use policies.

Operations



Truckee Tahoe Airport only experienced an 11% increase in operations and saw a 13% decrease in total noise comments than 2024.


Fly Quiet

In August, 30 households (6 new) submitted 77 noise comments. The majority of comments were from Martis Valley Estates (21) and Sierra Meadows (20). Three households generated 37% of all comments this month. Most common comments were jet departures from runway 29 and piston departures from runway 02 and 20.

There were 27 operations during designated quiet hours in August (compared to 39 in 2024). Of these, 21 followed the published shoulder-hour protocol (15 in 2024), and only 3 generated noise comments.

Fly Safe

This month's Fly Safe Seminar recorded the program's highest attendance to date, with **107 participants** joining in person and via Zoom. Guest speaker **Juan Browne**, an airline pilot and long-time local aviator whose YouTube channel *Blancolirio* has over 575K subscribers, presented on **Backcountry Flying**. His talk emphasized the importance of precision spot landings, weather planning, and terrain awareness. The lessons were highly relevant not only for backcountry pilots but also for all aviators seeking to sharpen day-to-day flying skills.

Next month's seminar will focus on **personal aircraft maintenance**, presented by local pilots Doug Lee and Bjorn Anderson. Topics will include preventative maintenance from a pilot's perspective, FAA-approved versus prohibited tasks, and how hands-on aircraft work can enhance pilot proficiency.

Additionally, Soar Truckee hosted the Fly Safe program's second pilot clinic of the year. Over two weekends, five glider pilots received both ground and flight training with a Certified Flight Instructor—Glider (CFI-G). The clinic covered tower operations, safe access to the "Hot Rocks" lift sources, altitude
