## Item 2 - Aviation Safety Seminar, Nov. 19, 2013

Our Fall Aviation Safety Seminar is planned and scheduled for Nov. 19, 2013 at 6:00 PM. John Fisher, Support Manager from the FAA's Airspace and Procedures Office will be presenting. Topics he will cover include operations at Oakland ARTCC and how TRK fits into the National Airspace system. He will also discuss current radar coverage limitations, transponder operations, flight following, glider operations, IFR clearances, approaches, departures, and the improvement expected with ADS-B. The Seminar will be held in the Airport District Community Rooms.

#### Item 5 – Runway Obstruction Removal Project

The Tahoe Truckee Sanitation Agency has given final approval for tree removal on their property. Staff anticipates physical removal of trees to begin by the end of Oct. This project will take approximately 2 weeks to complete.

# Item 6 – Potential Runway 20 Wind Shear Issue

Staff is in the process of following up on the concern raised by Mark Wirth regarding the potential for wind shear at the approach end of Runway 20. Mr. Wirth stated at the Sept. 26, 2013 Board Meeting that in his opinion, the trees are causing an issue for pilots as they approach the runway. Staff has asked

Reinard Brandley, Consulting Airport Engineer, to give an opinion as to this issue and advise the Airport as to any compliance or mitigation measures, if any, that should be done.

In preliminary discussions with various local and transient pilots, they are less concerned with the trees and feel the drop off at the end of the runway is the primary cause of the shear and down drafts. Some argue that removal of the trees may increase the effects of the shear because the trees would not be there to break up the effects of the wind. To assist pilots with managing wind and to add an extra level of safety, the District displaced the threshold 200 feet from the end of the runway, requiring pilots to land further down the runway from the drop off.

As of October 2013, aside from obstruction removal to be completed this month, all runways and approach design standards, safety areas, runway markings, signs, and advisories are compliant with FAA design criteria and mandatory runway design standards required by the FAA. Wind shear and downdrafts are a common weather pattern found at many airports, particularly high altitude airports. Pilot training standards require training and education in slow flight and low altitude operations including crosswind, wind shear, and up and downdrafts scenarios. The Airport endeavors to maintain a high quality runway facility, educate and advise pilots, provide a state of the art AWOS system (to be installed this year) and certified NOAA weather observers to assist pilots. It is staff's opinion that no amount of modification of the physical environment of the Airport will be able to eliminate the effects of the wind, but we do agree that all reasonable and effective safety measures should be considered. We will have Mr. Brandley do a preliminary analysis to see if they recommend any measures. We hope to have that report by January.
