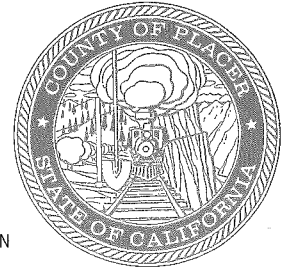

- Secure location for overnight parking for emergency equipment.

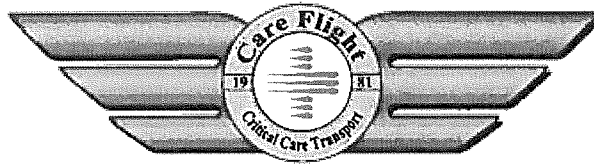

We commend your leadership and support in addressing this critical need for the North Lake Tahoe communities.

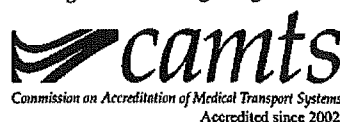

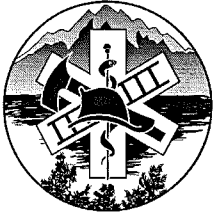
